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ACTIVE SHOOTER CDI EXECUTIVE SUMMARY





- The CDI outlined specific objectives for the Incident Review Board to include:
 - a. Develop a definitive timeline of events leading up to the incident
 - b. Evaluate the effectiveness of Command and Control and Incident Command procedures
 - c. Review Mutual Aid procedures and response
 - d. Evaluate the adequacy of exercise control procedures
 - e. Analyze current "lock down" procedures to include facility sweeps and clearing
 - f. Develop management recommendations and lessons learned





- 5 July 2018, Prep Meeting for 3rd Quarter Exercise between 88 ABW/CC and 88 ABW/IG
- **30 July 2018, WPAFB Exercise Week Begins**
- **2** August 2018, Active Shooter Exercise at Kittyhawk Chapel
 - 1151L: Active Shooter Exercise start time
 - 1200L: MSEL scheduled start time
 - 1217L: Lockdown issued for Exercise Active Shooter Event
 - 1223L: CAT Events Log Shows "all secure" for Exercise Active Shooter Event



Hospital Timeline

- 1227L: Real world 911 call; 88 MDG employee reported receiving cell phone call from another 88 MDG employee injured while running on base
- 1229L: 88 MDG employee located and taken to ER; twisted ankle while running
- **1231L:** PAUSEX for real world injured runner
- 1235L: Real world active shooter reported at hospital due to bleed over from exercise mass casualty event and real world injured runner
- 1238L: BDOC notified via landline of real world active shooter by a 88 MDG employee at the hospital
- **1239L:** Lockdown for real world active shooter at hospital
- 1240L: 88 SFS arrived and makes entry into hospital

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Hospital Timeline

- 1241L: 88 MDG employee in hospital Red Clinic calls downtown 911 reporting real world active shooter; Dayton PD respond to WPAFB
- 1246L: WPAFB Fire Dispatch notified of 3 shots fired in hospital Red Clinic
- 1252L: WPAFB Fire Dispatch reports 3 shots appear to have been fired by 88 SFS member
- 1252L: Dayton SWAT arrives at Gate 1A; Regional Dispatch initiates a city-wide "Code 99"
- 1254L: IC requests support from 3 mutual aid medics and SFS request mutual aid support from Dayton SWAT; Mutual aid responders and area law enforcement respond to WPAFB



Hospital Timeline

- 1258L: IC reports three shell casings (later confirmed to be five shell casings) in Red Clinic are from 88 SFS member and there is no victim
- 1300L: Individual in the Red Clinic reports to 911 being locked in a room and it is unknown if the active shooter is in the area
- 1301L: 911 call from a person reporting receipt of text message from a friend who works in the hospital and is hiding from an active shooter
- 1305L: Crews on scene are briefed it was an 88 SFS weapon discharge and Dayton PD advises all responding law enforcement personnel can cancel their response to WPAFB
- 1309L: Two Dayton PD and two 88 SFS members clearing the second floor report multiple gunshots in the stairwell; Responding area law enforcement gathered outside hospital rush into hospital





- 1339L: Primary sweeps terminated with negative findings
- 1340L: Secondary sweeps initiated by canine personnel and hospital personnel evacuated
- **1436L:** IC releases all mutual aid responders
- 1446L: "All Clear" issued
- 1520L: Secondary sweeps terminated with negative findings
- 1537L: All responding units terminated response
- 1600L: All exercise activities scheduled for the rest of the week are terminated



Recommendations Overview

- This independent investigation made broad and wide-ranging recommendations for consideration that covered a multitude of areas.
 - Some recommendations apply at the installation level and our internal exercise processes
 - Other recommendations relate to guidance at both the local and higher headquarters levels
 - Some recommendations address inter-operability between the installation and state and local responders
 - Specific recommendations that directly pertain to tactics, techniques, and procedures are considered For Official Use Only and not releasable to the public





- Poorly planned and executed base-wide exercise
 - While realism is important in training exercises, all personnel must be fully aware of exercise vs. real-world situations
 - Coordinating with all concerned organizations and then sticking with the agreed upon plan is essential to keeping everyone fully aware





- M-4 used to breach a locked door
 - All personnel must adhere to weapons safety training at all times – especially during high pressure situations
 - We will develop a better process for Security Forces to identify themselves to personnel taking shelter
 - If we train people to take shelter until the "all clear" we must also train them to recognize that signal

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- Lack of total community integration
 - Federal, State, and Local agencies need a thorough understanding of command and control
 - Federal, State, and Local agencies need a better understanding of jurisdiction
 - Response procedures amongst Federal, State, and Local agencies need to be established when crossing jurisdictional boundaries
